

What is the ACT?

The American Center Tashkent (ACT) is the Embassy's research and reference service. It offers users an extensive collection of books, videos and other materials on topics such as:

- U.S. politics, government and laws
- U.S. foreign policies, international relations and defense
- U.S. society, arts, culture and values
- U.S. and international economics, trade and business
- Civil society, human rights, media freedom and democratization
- Environmental and global issues

The reference collection exceeds 1,500 volumes. The ACT also has copies of leading American and Western newspapers and magazines in electronic or print formats.

The ACT can advise visitors about how to best utilize these resources to find authoritative, up-to-date information.

Who can use the ACT?

ACT services are available to the public. It is free and open to anyone 12 years and older. Grown-ups should accompany visitors 12 – 14 years old.

Do you accept reference requests?

Yes. If you have a specific question about a topic related to the United States, you may send it to the ACT via fax, e-mail or phone. The ACT makes every effort to respond as quickly as possible.

What are the working hours?

The ACT is open to the public, and visitors are able to use the facility on an appointment only basis, Monday through Thursday, from 9:30 to 12:00 and 13:00 to 17:00, and Friday from 13:00 to 16:00.
